Stanislaus County Emergency Bail Schedule
General Information

1. Pursuant to Penal Code Section 1269b, and Circulating Order Number: CO-20-11 issued by the Judicial Council of California (Judicial Council), the Superior Court of Stanislaus County (Superior Court) adopts this emergency bail schedule to address the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. With certain exceptions, this emergency bail schedule is based on the COVID-19 Emergency Bail Schedule (Emergency Rule 4), the Judicial Council adopted on April 6, 2020, and rescinded effective June 20, 2020.
2. The emergency bail schedule is effective on February 19, 2021, and will remain in effect until repealed or amended by the Superior Court.
3. Adoption of this emergency bail schedule does not require bail be reset for any person for whom bail was set in accordance with the COVID-19 Emergency Bail Schedule (Emergency Rule 4.)
4. **Setting of bail and exceptions**

Under this emergency bail schedule, bail for all misdemeanor and felony offenses must be set at \$0, with the exception of only the offenses listed below:

- (1). A serious felony, as defined in Penal Code section 1192.7(c), or a violent felony, as defined in Penal Code section 667.5(c);
- (2). A felony violation of Penal Code section 69;
- (3). A violation of Penal Code section 166(c)(1);
- (4). A violation of Penal Code section 136.1 when punishment is imposed under section 136.1(c);
- (5). A violation of Penal Code section 262;
- (6). A violation of Penal Code sections 243(e)(1) or 273.5;
- (7). A violation of Penal Code section 273.6 if the detained person made threats to kill or harm, has engaged in violence against, or has gone to the residence or workplace of, the protected party;
- (8). A violation of Penal Code section 422 where the offense is punished as a felony;
- (9). A violation of Penal Code section 646.9;
- (10). A violation of an offense listed in Penal Code section 290(c);
- (11). A violation of Vehicle Code sections 23152 or 23153;
- (12). A felony violation of Penal Code section 463; and

- (13). A violation of Penal Code section 29800.
- (14). A violation of Penal Code sections 25850(a), 25850(a)(2), 25850(c)(1), 25850(c)(2), 25850(c)(3), or 25850(c)(6)
- (15). A violation of Penal Code section 30605(a)
- (16). A felony violation of Penal Code section 245(a)(4)
- (17). A felony violation of Penal Code sections 368(a)(1) or 368(b)(1)
- (18). A violation of Penal Code sections 30305(a)(1) or 30305(b)(1)

5. In addition, the Emergency Bail Schedule does not apply and bail will not be set a \$0.00, if any of the following conditions apply:

- (1) The person arrested is subject to an outstanding bench warrant issued by the Court for the person's failure to appear;
- (2) The person is arrested on multiple charges and at least one charge is listed in subsection 4.1(1) – (51), above;
- (3) The person is arrested on a violation of felony probation, PRCS, mandatory supervision, and/or parole.

6. **Application of countywide bail schedule**

The current countywide bail schedule effective February 16, 2021, remains in effect for all offenses listed as exceptions in subsection 4.1(1) through (51) above, including any count-specific conduct enhancements and any status enhancements, or if the person arrested is subject to a condition set forth in subsection 5. (1)-(3), above.

7. **Ability to deny bail**

Nothing in the Emergency Bail Schedule restricts the ability of the court to deny bail as authorized by article I, section 12, or 28(f)(3) of the California Constitution.
